SYNOPSIS OF INVESTIGATION: Two of three computers to which Ray GRICAR had access were obtained and turned over to Cpl. LAINO for hard drive analysis. File prints for Ray GRICAR and Susan PILLOTKNISELY were located and retrieved, and arrangements were made for Patricia FORNICOLA to provide prints on 04/19. Information for a Victim Checklist was obtained, with all approapriate information being shared with Bellefonte Police. Items for DNA were obatined from GRICAR's residence and entered into evidence.

DETAILS: Telephone contact was made with Cpl. Thomas LAINO, PSP Hollidaysburg, and a request made for him to analyze hard drives of computers to which Ray GRICAR had access. LAINO asked that the IT supervisor for Centre County be contacted to learn if there was a server for e-mail and if the desktop computer in the District Attorney's Office could be pulled without causing interruption in the system. LAINO met with county personnel and this officer at the courthouse and obtained the computer there, and then retrieved a home laptop that had been brought to Bellefonte Police by Patricia FORNICOLA. The office laptop GRICAR used could not be located at his home or in the office.

A check was made with Lt. DRESSLER at PSP Intelligence in Harrisburg relative to a contact with J-NET for file prints when a subject requests access. It was later learned that said prints were returned to the requester after a criminal history was done. A check was then made with Sue KELLER of Centre County Communications, and she advised that Ray GRICAR had not completed training and had no file prints were available for him. KELLER did provide prints for Susan PILLOT, and stated that prints for FORNICOLA had not yet been returned for filing. It was learned that GRICAR had provided elimination prints in a homicide investigation years ago, and these prints were retrieved and turned over to me by Officer THAL, Bellefonte PD. Arrangements were made for FORNICOLA to ppear on 04/16 to provide elimination prints.

The following items were collected at GRICAR's home so a DNA profile could be established for him: an Oral-B toothbrush, a black comb, a green ball cap, and a worn white T-shirt. These items were entered into evidence under property record #G7-10172(A).

Information was obtained, from FORNICOLA, for the completion of the attached Victim Checklist.

He told his paramour that he took a drive to Raystown Lake and the Altoona area, and returned home around the time she came home from work. It was unknown when he may have had actual contact with her last. He did not have close friendships.									
KNOWN ENEMIES: Due to the nature of his job as a prosecutor for over 20 years, the subject was likely to have had many persons who didn't like him. He did not, however, have subjects who recently indicated a desire to retaliate against him for court action taken against them. He had no enemies outside the realm of his employ.

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The Chief said that the subject's brother had committed suicide by drowning several years ago, but GRICAR had no known diagnosis or mental health history. A query showed that there were no handguns registered to GRICAR, and FORNICOLA had indicated that the only gun in their home was a muzzleloader which was still at the house. DIXON said that GRICAR was to have a PSECU credit card, but no account numbers were readily available and personnel were not responding to calls or messages as it was the week-end. Messages had been sent out, and a press conference was held at the Bellefonte Police Station at 1700 hours on 04/16/05 in an effort to alert the public and gain leads.

Telephone contact was made with personnel at the PA State Police Intelligence Center, (877)777-6835 and they advised that a search warrant or subpoena was necessary for them to obtain a credit history to identify possible other accounts held by GRICAR. This information was passed along to Chief DIXON.

Telephone contact was made with Tpr. David SNYDER, Troop G Fugitive task force, and a request made for database queries that may provide additional information. SNYDER conducted said queries, but was unable to find accounts or applicable records.

As per a relay from Sgt. BYRON, a suggestion was made that records for the home telephone of GRICAR and FORNICOLA be obtained to show incoming and outgoing calls from the residence.

Patricia Elizabeth FORNICOLA was interviewed briefly at the Bellefonte Police station. She stated that she had lived with Ray GRICAR for approximately four years, and their relationship had been a good one. She said that they had not had many disagreements. and no recent ill history of any type. She said that she had noted nothing really different in Ray's behavior except that he had been very tired in the past three weeks, taking naps often. She said that he rarely went to the doctor for treatment, but she believed that his general physician was someone with the Geisinger Group in Bellefonte. She said that once during their relationship, he went there for a referral to an eye specialist as he had a pressure condition which required periodic checks. She thought that his eye doctor was named TATCHER and was located in the Bush House in Bellefonte. She knew of no other medical or mental health conditions from which Ray may suffer. FORNICOLA advised that work appeared to have been going well for Ray, and he was looking forward to retirement. She said that the situation with ADA Steve SLOANE illness and inability to work had been stressful for Ray, but no more in recent days that it had been for years. Patti said that Ray had been working on some briefs, and she noted nothing out of character for him other than he had not been going in to the office as much as usual as he neared retirement.

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FORNICOLA said that GRICAR had possible plans of making an unscheduled trip out went to his daughter's in Seattle. She said that in May of 2004, Ray gave his old vehicle to his daughter, and at that time, thought it would be an adventure to drive across country with no actual schedule. She said that he did not make the trip at that time, but recently had told her that he didn't because he knew that she would be worried. He expressed that he really wanted to make such a trip, and she told him that although she would be concerned, she would support him. Patti said that on 04/14, Ray attended a prison board meeting in the morning. He then called her and said that he was going to take the rest of the day off and go for a drive, advising that he would be home by the time she came from work. When he came home, he said that he had driven to Lake Raystown and the Altoona area. FORNICOLA said that after dinner, she and Ray took a walk, and she suggested that he take a smaller adventure as opposed to cross country, and Ray indicated that he would think about it. She said that Ray went into the office while she went grocery shopping, and everything appeared fine and normal. On Friday morning, Patti said that Ray told her that he wasn't going in to the office, and she encouraged him taking time off. She said that they had juice, and Ray fell back asleep by the time she was ready to leave for work, so she left him a note asking that he let her know what he was doing. She said that around 1130, Ray called and said that he was on route 192, and asked her to take care of the dog as he wasn't going to get home to do so. She said fine, and after both said, "I love you," the call ended. She said that Ray wasn't home when she came after work, and still wasn't home when she returned from the gym. She attempted to call his cell, but merely got his voicemail. As there had never been a time in their relationship that Ray had not called and let her know where he was, she became very concerned and finally made a report to Bellefonte Police late that night. Patti said that on the prior week-end, they had planned to attend a car show in Meyersdale, PA, but decoded not to go when they realized how far it was. She said that they intended to do yard work and get haircuts on 04/15, and possibly take a ride on 04/16 if they got everything done. FORNICOLA said that she felt it possible that Ray may have gone to the Lewisburg area as they had gone there before. She said that they had looked at antiques at an old mill, and Ray liked to eat in the Italian Garden Restaurant across the river. She said that when they traveled, they usually stayed in Bed and Breakfasts, and didn't know of Ray to have any point cards with motel chains. She said that on his travels, Ray liked to buy a New York Times and read it with coffee, and may look at antiques. Otherwise, she said that he liked to hike and look at old cars. She said that she could determine that he was likely wearing jeans, white sneakers, and a blue fleece when he left as these items were missing from the house, but said that his hiking boots were home. She could see nothing else missing from the house, including his glasses and all personal items. She said that Ray didn't have close friends, identifying Steve SLOANE as his closest male friend. She said that he had remained friends with Barbara PETITO, but in recent conversation, he said that he had not heard from her for some time. PETITO now worked for the Attorney General's office in Harrisburg. FORNICOLA had no idea what may have happened to GRICAR, and was very concerned about him.
